

## **BRIEF SUMMARY OF POWER COMPANY NAME CHANGES AND ACQUISITIONS THROUGH HISTORY**

- July 16, 1894** Owners of "Water Powers" in Grand Rapids area, sign an agreement to consolidate.
- Nov. 10, 1902** Articles of Incorporation of Consolidated Water Power Co. amended to include the manufacture of paper and pulp and the name changed to Consolidated Water Power & Paper Co.
- Dec. 4, 1918** State of Wisconsin approved the creation of the Oneida Paper Co.
- Nov. 5, 1919** Oneida Paper Co. petitioned the State of Wisconsin and received permission to change the name from Oneida Paper Co. to Oneida Power Co. and the intent was to change from a Private Utility to a Public Utility.
- Jan. 21, 1920** At the annual meeting of Oneida Power Co. there was a report on the progress of securing riparian rights and transfer of property from The Jackson Milling Co. to Oneida Power Co.
- May 23, 1921** Stockholders received a Certificate of Approval from the Railroad Commission of Wisconsin to issue \$900,000.00 in bonds. These bonds were then transferred to Consolidated Water Power and Paper Co. in part payment of indebtedness.
- Apr. 26, 1926** At a Special Meeting of the Stockholders, it was resolved that the name of the Oneida Power Co. be changed to Consolidated Water Power Co.-they also petitioned the Railroad Commission of Wisconsin to expand the purpose of the Company from producing and selling power to building dams, canals, transmission lines, etc.
- June 2, 1926** Stockholders adopted resolution to purchase the dams and power facilities owned by Consolidated Water Power & Paper Co. in the City of Wisconsin Rapids and in the Village of Biron to Consolidated Water Power Company.

- Aug. 8, 1938** Voted to file with the Federal Power Commission an intent to build a Dam & Powerhouse near Knowlton, Wisconsin.
- July 23, 1941** Voted to file an application for a License from the Federal Power Commission for the project at Knowlton, Wisconsin.
- July 28, 1943** Agreed to purchase the right to 30 Horsepower of Water Power produced at Wisconsin Rapids, formerly owned by American Carbonic Machine Co., from Nekoosa Papers at a cost of \$20,000.00-(evidently this was an old Water Power owner from the 1890 era that had never been purchased by CWPCo.)
- Aug. 1, 1945** The Dam and Power facilities at Wisconsin River Division in the Village of Whiting were purchased from the Parent Company.
- Jan. 26, 1948** Permission was granted by the authorities to begin construction on the Petenwell and Castle Rock projects. The Stock was owned in thirds by: Wisconsin Public Service Corp, Wisconsin Power & Light Co. and Consolidated Water Power & Paper Company. When completed, the operations was entrusted to Consolidated Water Power Company. The new Company formed was called Wisconsin River Power Company.
- June 18, 1974** The one third Stock ownership of Consolidated Water Power and Paper Co. in Wisconsin River Power Company was transferred to Consolidated Water Power Co. Thus the entire ownership of Wisconsin River Power Company was held by three Public Utilities operating in the State of Wisconsin.
