Library Spaces

The Adult Room houses the adult books. It is the most "library-like" part of the Library. It has computers, wireless Internet, book displays and quiet.



The Children's Room is a livelier environment, with toys, trains, books, computers, and DVDs.

The Lower Level is home to the DVDs, audiobooks, videos and CDs, as well as the magazine and newspaper collections.



There are additional computers, wireless Internet, relaxed Rules of Conduct and lots of space for relaxing, visiting, and studying.

Meeting Rooms

- Fine Arts Center - 232 seat theater, with lights and sound system.
- All Purpose Room - Seats up to 80, tables, chairs, kitchenette.
- McCourt Room - Seats 10-25.

Technology & Computers

- Twenty-four Internet stations. Register on screen with your library card. Word processing is available on many computers.
- Wireless Internet throughout the Adult Room and the Lower Level courtesy of Charter Communications.
- Our on-line catalog is shared with 38 other public libraries, which together own over three million items. Materials in the catalog can be reserved. Delivery time for materials on shelf at other libraries is usually 2-3 days.
- Our website includes access to the catalog, information about the Library and Library programs, and digitized local history.
- Large magazine and genealogy databases accessible through our website.



Using the Library

- Library Cards are free with appropriate ID. Minors need parent's permission. Replacements - 50¢.
- Late Fees - Adult materials 10¢ per day, Children's materials 5¢, Videos & DVDs 25¢.
- Loan Periods - Most items are loaned for 28 days. Magazines circulate for 14 days. DVD & VHS movies are loaned for 7 days.
- Renewals - Most items can be renewed twice, unless on reserve for another patron. Renew items at the catalog, any service desk, via the Internet or by phone (422-5133).
- Three self checkout stations, to speed you on your way.
